


Figure 1.1: Derivation of implementations (platform-specific models) from an architectural reference Model (**TNR 10pt, Figure 1.1: Bold, line spacing before and after 0**)

PRODUCTION FEATURES

- The maximum number of pages of the Report should be preferably between **35-60** pages.
- **Synopsis Report: Methodology should contain brief discussion and flow chart of work. No results and conclusion**
- **Mid Term Report:** Detailed Methodology and results should be of Report.

Abstract

1. The abstract of the report should be limited to 200-300 words. (**must be added in FINAL REPORT ONLY**)
2. A list of keywords should follow in the end of the abstract.

Paper Size

3. The standard size of paper of a Report is A4 paper size is a widely used standard, measuring 210 millimeters by 297 millimeters (8.27 inches by 11.69 inches).
4. Oversized figures and tables, if any, should be reduced to fit with the size of the report but the reduction should not be so drastic as to impair clarity of their contents. One may also fold these pages to fit with the report size.

Table and Figure

5. The *minimum font size of materials within a table or a figure* can be 8 point, however
6. Table caption [TNR 12, center] should be written **ABOVE the prescribed Table in the text.**
7. Figure Caption [TNR 12, center] should be written **BELOW the prescribed Figure in the text**

Single-Sided

8. The report should be printed on one side of the paper

Page Numbering

9. Page numbers for the prefacing materials (Certificate, Abstract, etc..) of the report shall be in small Roman numerals and should be centered at the bottom of the pages.
10. Page numbers for the body of the report should be in Arabic numerals and

should be centered at the bottom of the pages. The pagination should start with the first page of Chapter 1 and should continue throughout the text (including tables, figures, and appendices)

Font

11. The preferred font size of the text in the report is 12 point.
12. The preferred font type is Times New Roman.
13. Heading1 (Bold,16pt)/ Heading 2 (Bold, 14 pt)/ Heading 3 (Bold, 12 pt)

Margins

14. A margin of 3.75 cm (1½ inch) is to be given on the binding edge while on the other sides it is to be 2.5 cm (1 inch). The text of the report, including headings, figures, tables, and notes, but excluding page numbers, must be accommodated within the page area.

Line Spacing

15. The line spacing in the main text must be between 1.5 line spacing. *Single linespacing should be given for abstract, declaration, figure captions, table titles, figure legends, footnotes, and references.*

16. IEEE style to be followed.
17. Use any reference manager tool like Mendeley/ Zotero/ etc.

18. Minimum 60-70 references should be added in Report.

19. Each appendix should be identified as Appendix A, Appendix B, etc.
20. It should also have a title.
